SUBJECT: Journal for the Month of October 1944

TO : COMMANDING OFFICER, 540th Engineer Regiment, APO #758, U.S. ARMY

October 1st to October 31st 1944

Furnished necessary enlisted men personnel for the operation of the following Regimental Staff Sections, S-1, Personnel, S-2, S-3, S-4 and Regimental Motor Pool. Operated showers for Officers and Enlisted Men as well as all troops in surrounding area. Operating Regimental Gas Dump which supplies an average of 3,000 gallons of gas and oil daily to regiment and attached troops. Secured sites and operated and maintained three Army Water Points for troops which supplied an average of 70,000 gallons of water per day. Throughout the month we had water points located in the following places for supplying all troops in the locality. City of Amance, City of Gray, City of Dole, City of Bayon, City of Mirecourt and 21st General Hospital at Mirecourt, France. All trucks and air-compressors dispatched throughout the month on various jobs of hauling for 7th Army Engineer and while not employed in this activity worked with battalions on road, bridge and construction work. Road Grader used by battalions daily for road patrol work as well as work at hospital site. Grease dispenser lubricator dispatched daily to battalions for greasing all motor pool equipment. C.W.O. John Whates, appointed to the grade of 2nd Lt. A.U.S. on the 28th October 1944. Moved from Gray, France to Mirecourt, France on 5 October 1944 in advance to set up site for Regimental Headquarters and our company. Normal Regimental Headquarters and Service Company functions.
