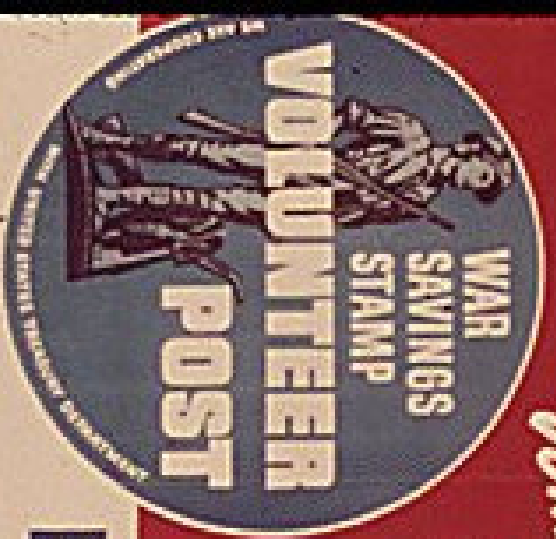

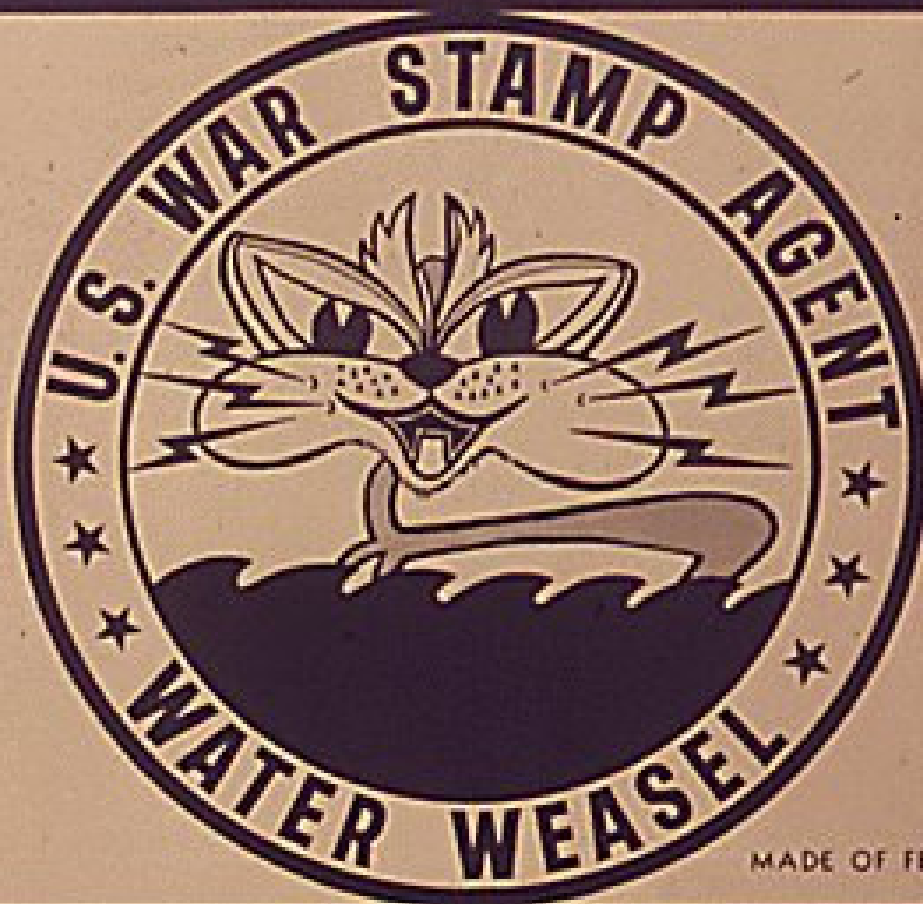

FRESH FRUITS ARE BEST IN SEASON *with care...they'll keep within reason.*



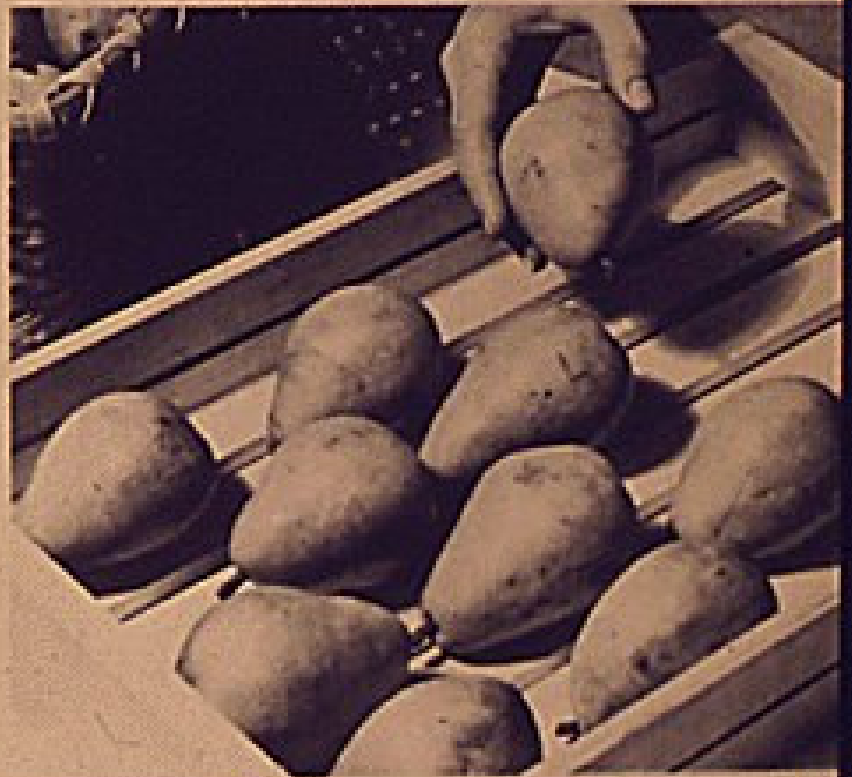
*Spread berries

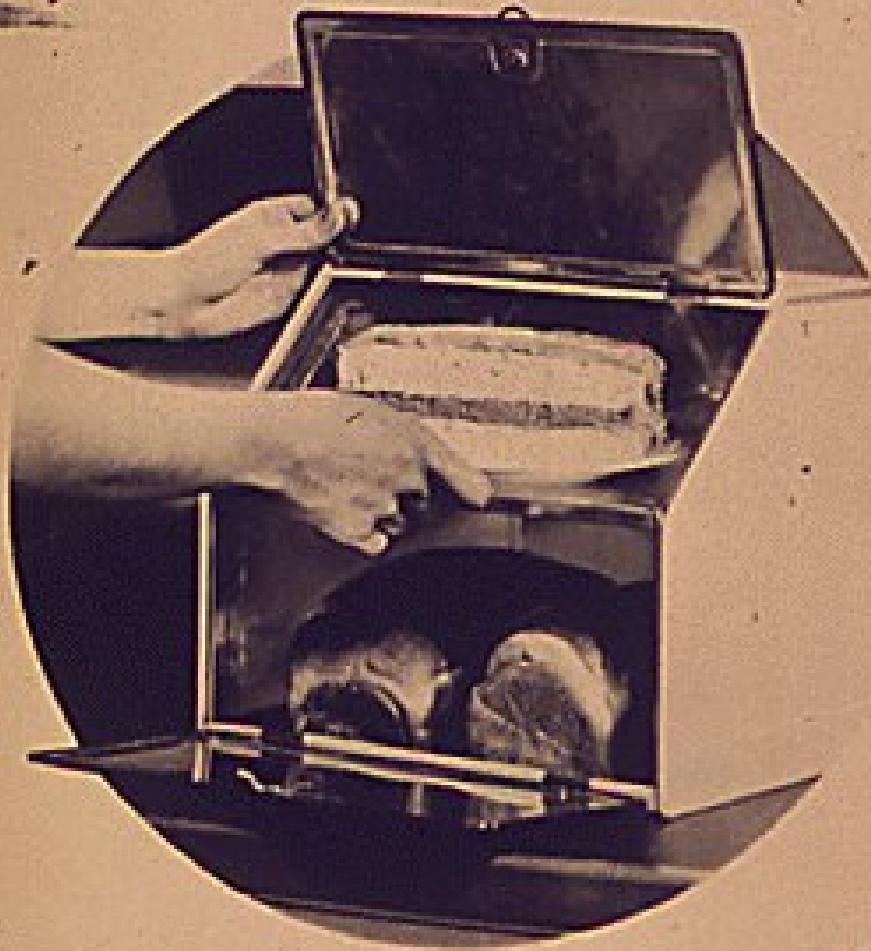
*Don't pinch, bruise or

- Wash and cap just before using

- Be gentle with tender skinned fruit.
- Spread to keep from bruising.
- Keep ripe fruit cold.
- Let under-ripe fruit ripen at room temperature to bring out the flavor.



TO KEEP BREAD, CAKE, and COOKIES NICE protect from insects, mold, and mice.



- Keep bread and cake separate.
- Store bread in a ventilated box.
- If home baked, cool before storing.
- In hot, damp weather put in refrigerator.

• Scald.... air.... and sun
the bread box often.

• Cookies stay fresh longer
in tightly covered jar.



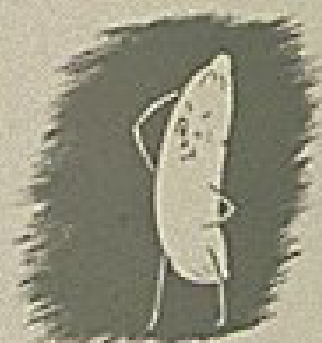

- Wash salad greens.... drain.... store in vegetable pan.... keep cold.



*To freshen

- Trim non-edible parts from tender roots or cooking greens.
- Wash.... drain.... put in covered pan.... keep cold.



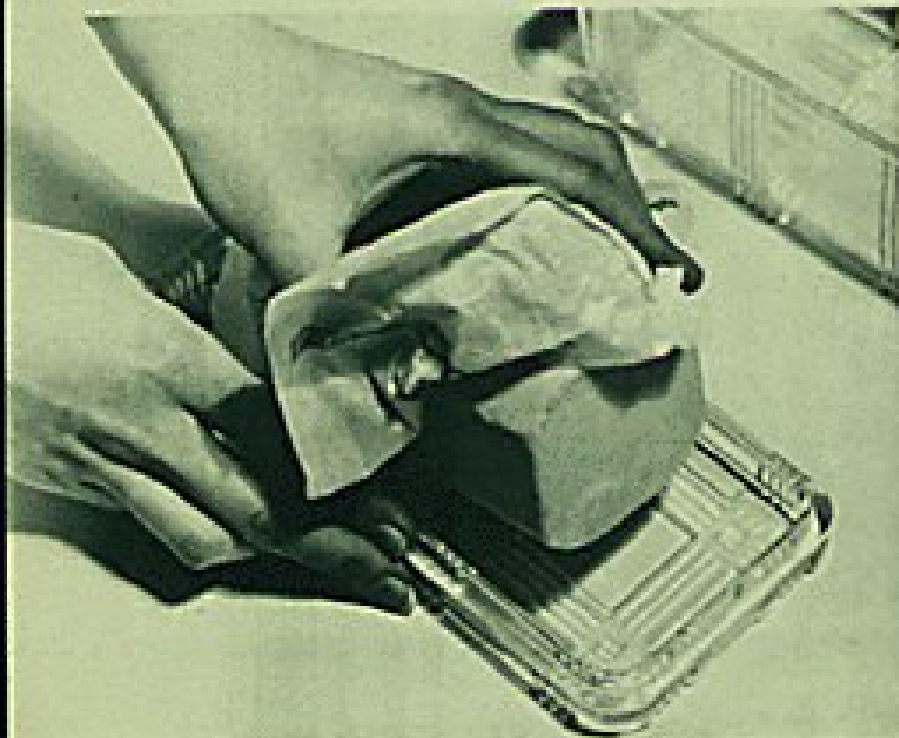
To hold the sweet in....



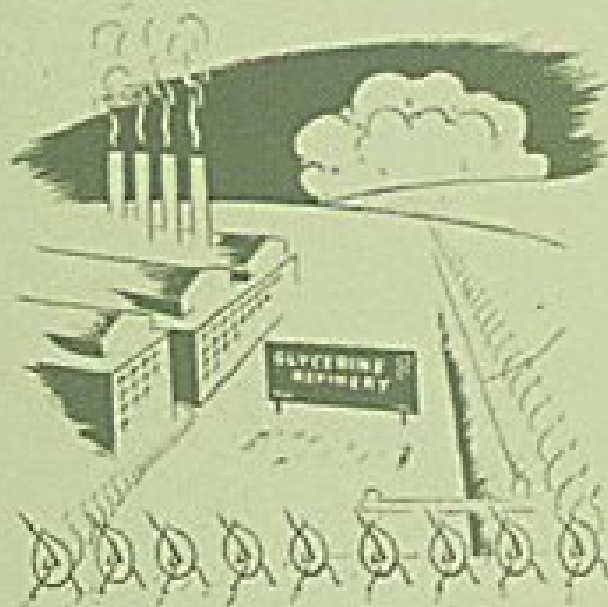
Corn, Peas, Lima Beans
keep cold.... let stay in pod or husk unless you can store tightly covered in refrigerator.



SAVE EVERY DROP OF OIL OR FAT



- Put table fats in covered dish.
- Store in cold, dark place.... away from strong odors.



FATS OFF TO WAR

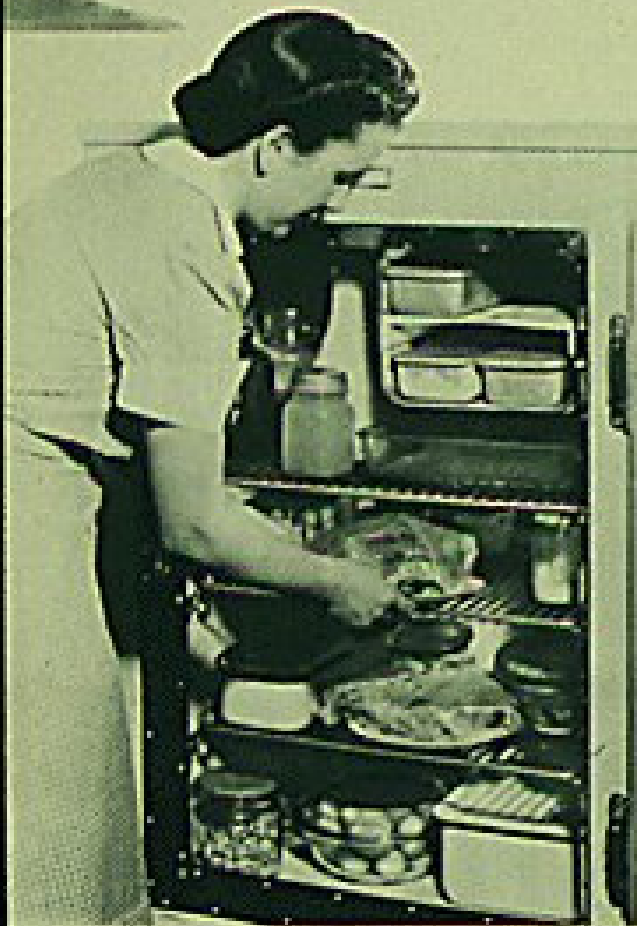
- Keep cooking fats in cool.... dry.... dark place.
- Strain fat drippings to remove food particles...store in clean jars.
- Don't let stand on back of stove.

COOKED MEAT, POULTRY, and FISH



- Cool cooked meats quickly.
- Cover well.
- Keep cold.



- Pour soup, broth or stew into jar.... cool quickly.... cover.... keep cold.
- Left standing in the kitchen it makes a 'Happy Hunting Ground' for bacteria.

- Cut meats for salad and sandwiches just before using.
- Meat spreads and salads should be kept very cold until served.

MEAT, POULTRY, FISH are full of flavor *a cold dry place is what they favor.*

The meat dish
in refrigerator
is the ideal place



- Cover fresh meat or poultry loosely.... keep very cold.... 45° F. or lower.
- Put ground fresh meat in clean dish.... cover.... keep very cold.
- Fish and ground fresh meats spoil quickly even in a cold place. *Don't keep more than 24 hrs.*



- If you don't have a refrigerator you can keep perishable food for a short time in a spring house or a cold cellar.

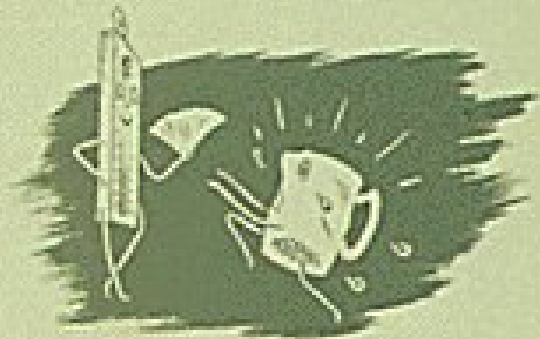

MILK and EGGS - NATURE'S FOOD

- Clean milk will keep several days at 40° - 45° F.



- Don't let milk stand at room temperature it spoils quickly.

- Cool quickly
- Cover
- Keep cold
- Use soon

1. EAT RIGHT

Plenty of baths, lots of soap. Clean hands, clothes, houses, beds! Get fresh air, sunshine. Drink plenty of water.



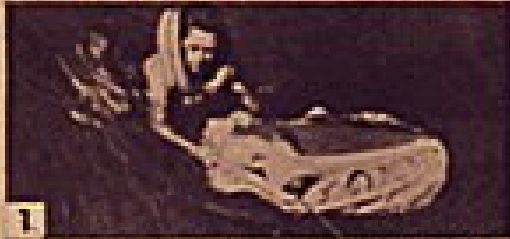
5. "PLAY" SOME EACH DAY

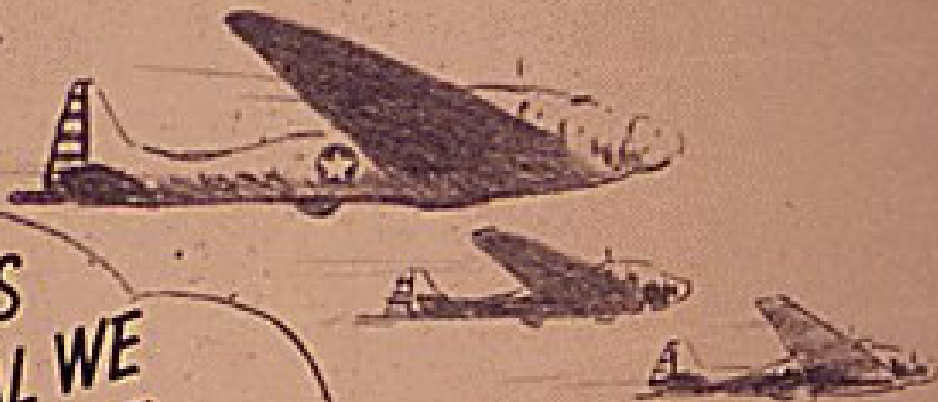

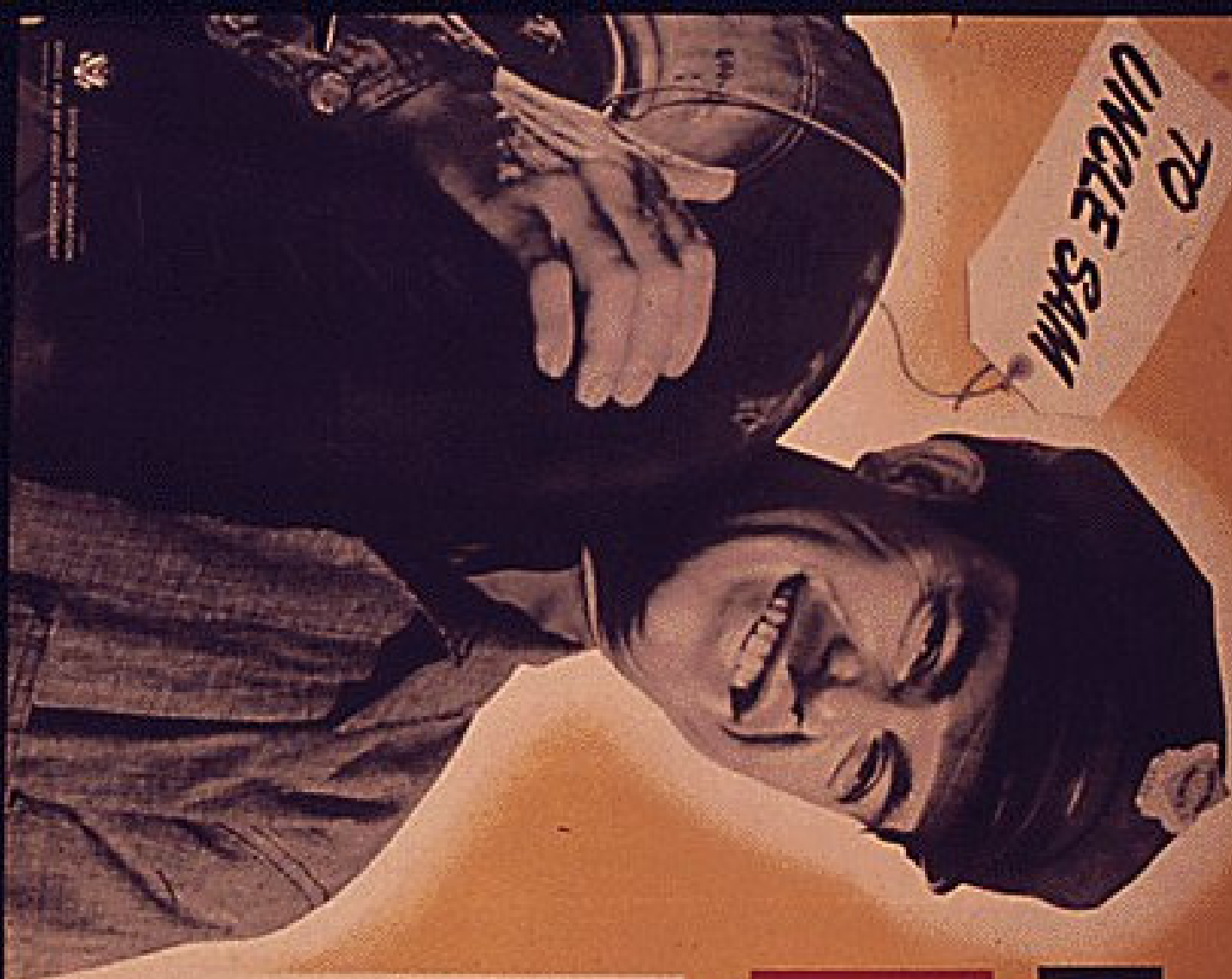

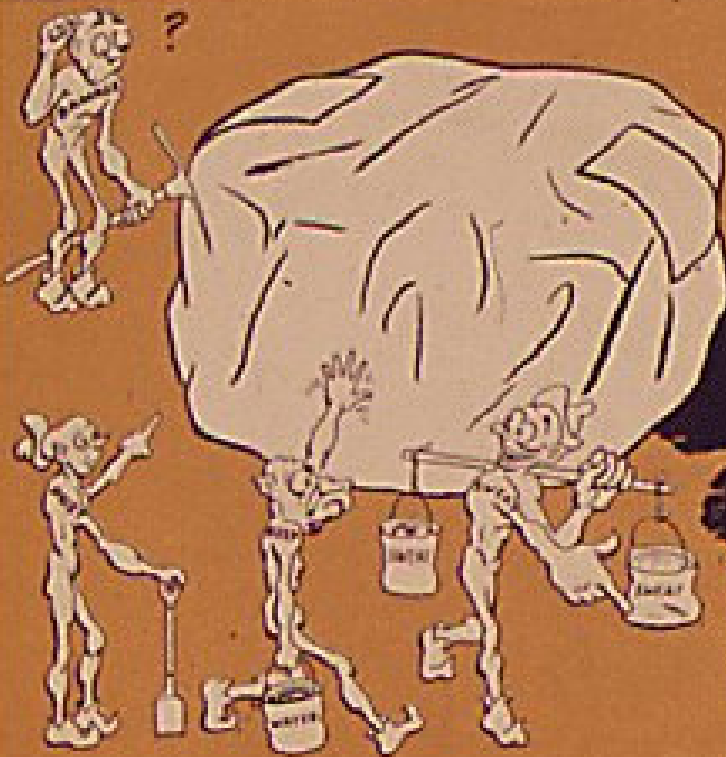

KEEP BEARINGS WRAPPED

A bearing without a wrapper is like a soldier without a fox hole. It hasn't got a chance against its enemies—rust, dust, sweat, and damage. Antifriction bearings are scarce. Protect them. Keep them wrapped.

1. If you unwrap a bearing for any reason, wrap it again before storing.
2. Never issue an unwrapped bearing.
3. If you receive an unwrapped bearing, wrap it before storing.
4. Keep bearings wrapped at all times—right up until the time they are installed.



MAINTENANCE MIKE SAYS:

*"Keep Bearings
Clean and
Lubricated, too!"*

Do you have unwrapped antifriction bearings in stock? If you have—clean, oil, and wrap them now. Don't delay. Do it right away.
