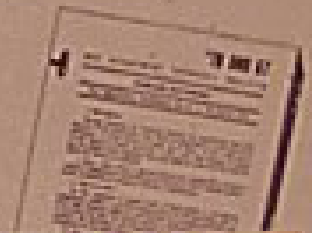


Maintenance Mike says:

HERE'S HOW...

1. Check your battery at least once a week.
2. Test battery voltage or specific gravity.
3. Check electrolyte and replenish if needed.
4. Inspect battery case for cracks or leaks.
5. Check battery carrier for dirt or corrosion.
6. Inspect cable connections and mounting clamps.
7. Clean battery, vent caps, clamps, and terminals.
8. Protect the connections against corrosion.
9. Watch ammeter—be sure generator is charging.
10. Be careful not to run battery down with starter.

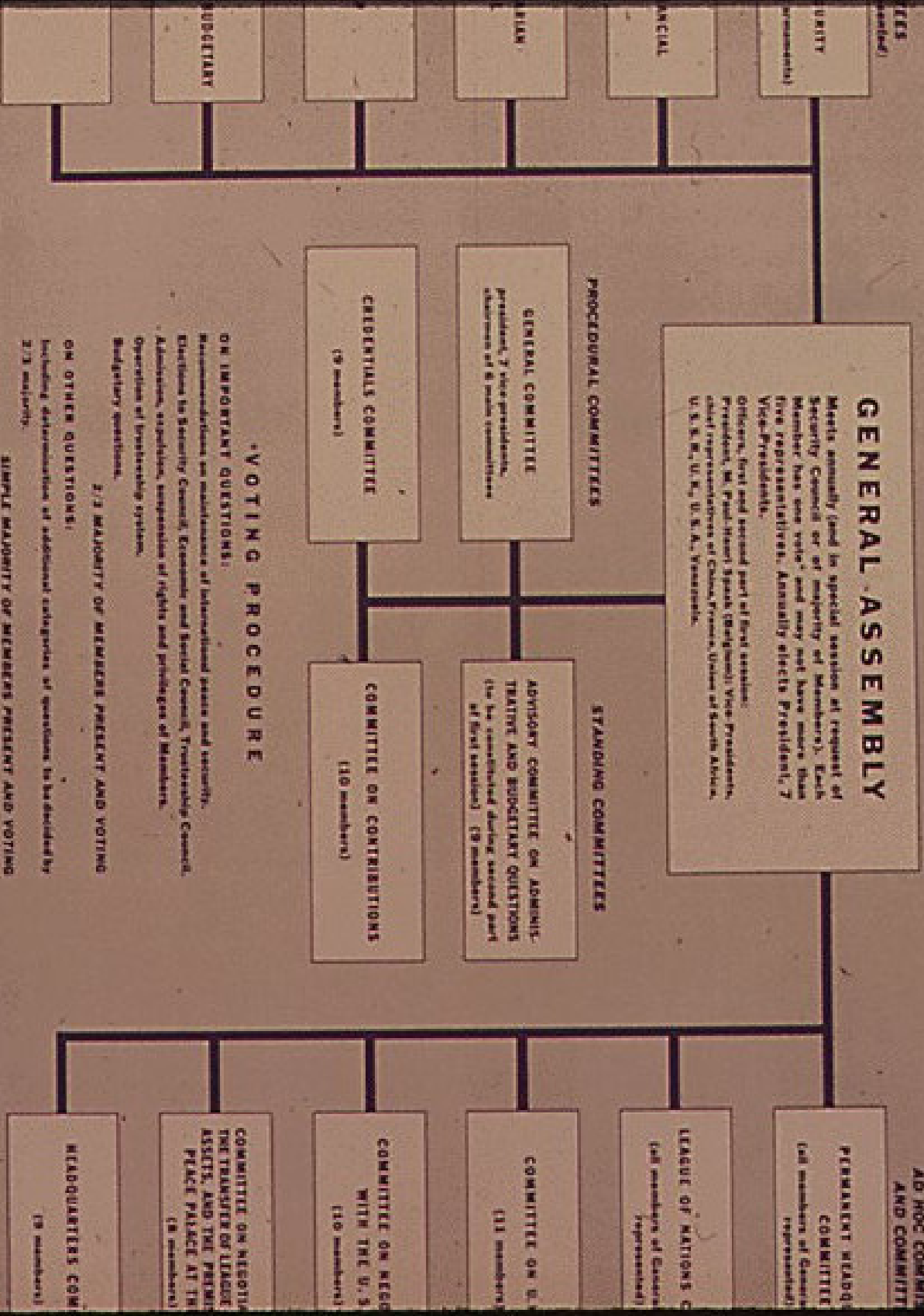

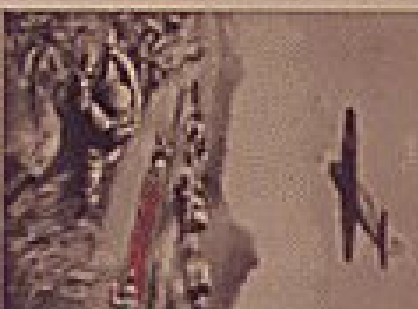
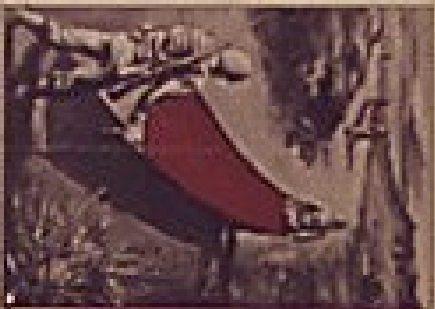

MUTUAL RECOGNITION BETWEEN AIR AND GROUND FORCES MUST BE ACCURATE AND RAPID, AND SHOULD MEANS OF RECOGNITION SIGNALING BY GROUND TROOPS TO AIRPLANE SHOULD BE EASY TO USE, WITH SIGNALS BEING TRANSMITTED IN THE CASE OF SEVERAL SIGNAL MEANS. SPEED AND ACCURACY MUST BE STRESSING, AND IN CASE OF VERY LIMITED VISIBILITY AS A MEANS OF IDENTIFICATION OF LOW-LEVEL UNITS, PRIMARY RELIANCE MUST BE PLACED ON VISUAL RECOGNITION SIGNALS.

Sure-We'll "Share the Meat"



THERE'S no "Eating as Usual" anymore—until we win a war.

That's why, among other foods now restricted, we must Share the Meat.

If we share this fine protein food on the government's recommended basis—2½ pounds per week per person over 12 years old—there is enough for all.

After Them—You Come First

Ours are the best-led fighting forces in the world and must be kept as at any sacrifice. Out of the bumper crop of 24 billion pounds of meat this year our fighters and their allies get 5½ billion pounds. This leaves 17½ billion pounds for the rest of us—which is enough . . . if we plan carefully.

The Good Nutrition of Meat

Stretch your share of meat over the week to insure a regular supply of the fine quality proteins, B vitamins and minerals which meat contains.

Learn more cuts of meat. Serve smaller portions. Plan leftovers carefully. Avoid waste in cooking and at the table. Make every pound count.

Remember, every ounce you go over your share, whether you're eating at home or dining out, takes that amount away from some other American.

If everyone is on the square, everyone will have his share.

QUIZ ON MEAT SHARING

1. Where is Meat Sharing in effect?

A. Everywhere in the United States.

2. Are children entitled to the same share as adults?

A. No. If they are under 12 years old, children 1 to 12 get entitled to 1½ lbs. per week, under 1½% lb.

4. Does the 2½ pounds per week include meats eaten out as well as at home?

A. Yes. Meat eaten in hotels, restaurants, dining cars and at a guest or service club is taken in to the share if your sharing allowance is 1½ or less.

5. Does it apply to persons who slaughter their own meat and those who maintain freezer lockers?

A. The law applies to share and share alike.



6. Does it include meat fed to dogs and cats?

A. Yes. Anyone who feeds beef, veal, pork, lamb or mutton to pets should deduct it from his own allowance.

7. Does the sharing allowance include the weight of the bone and gristle?

A. Yes. It is based on "bone in." A pound of rib roast of beef with the bone in is the same sharing allowance as one the same weight of round steak.

8. Can a host or hostess buy sufficient amounts of the restricted meats to feed a dinner party?

A. Yes. But each guest should deduct his or her portion from the weekly 2½ pound quota. In other words, for guests, the principle is the same as that of the voluntary cut-out at a restaurant.

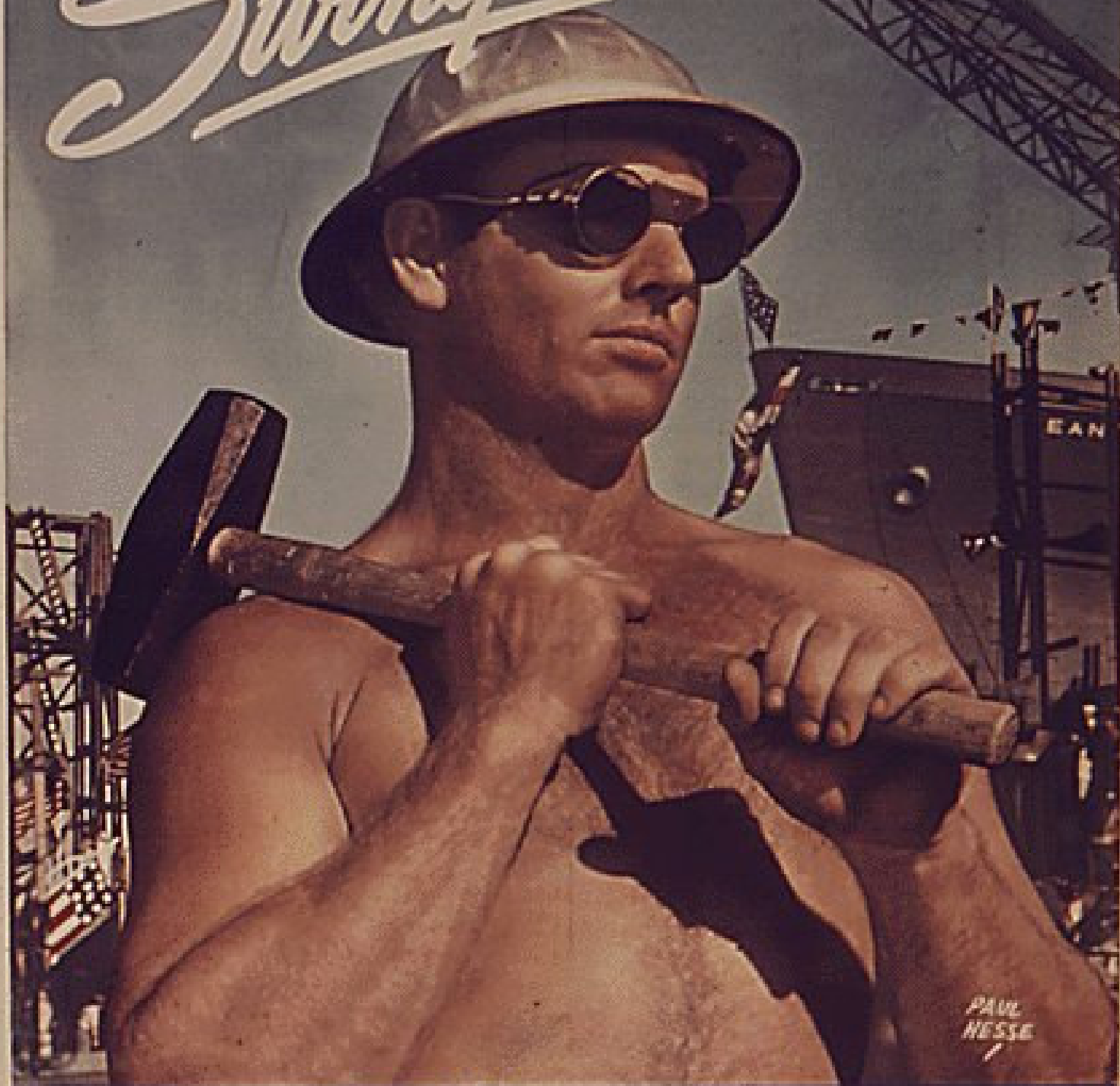

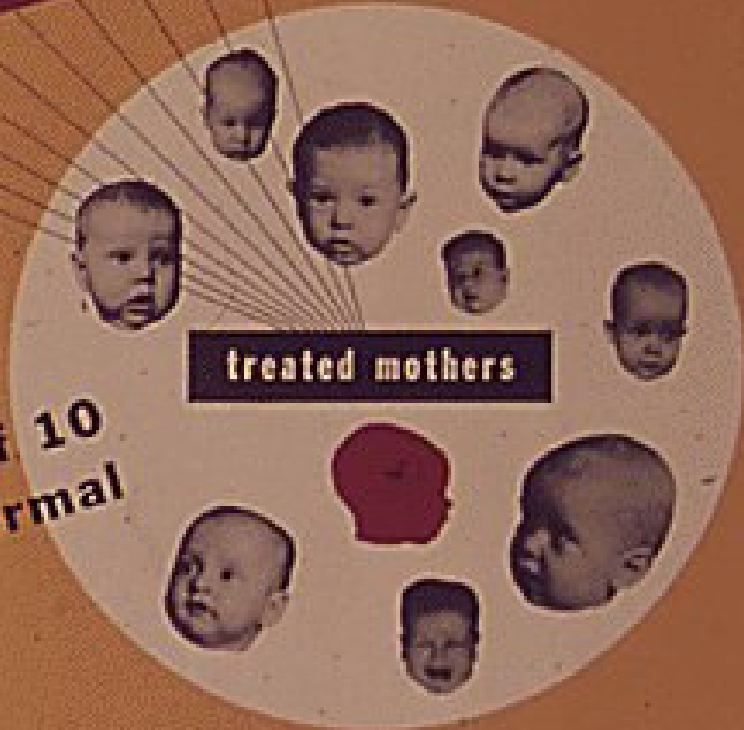
