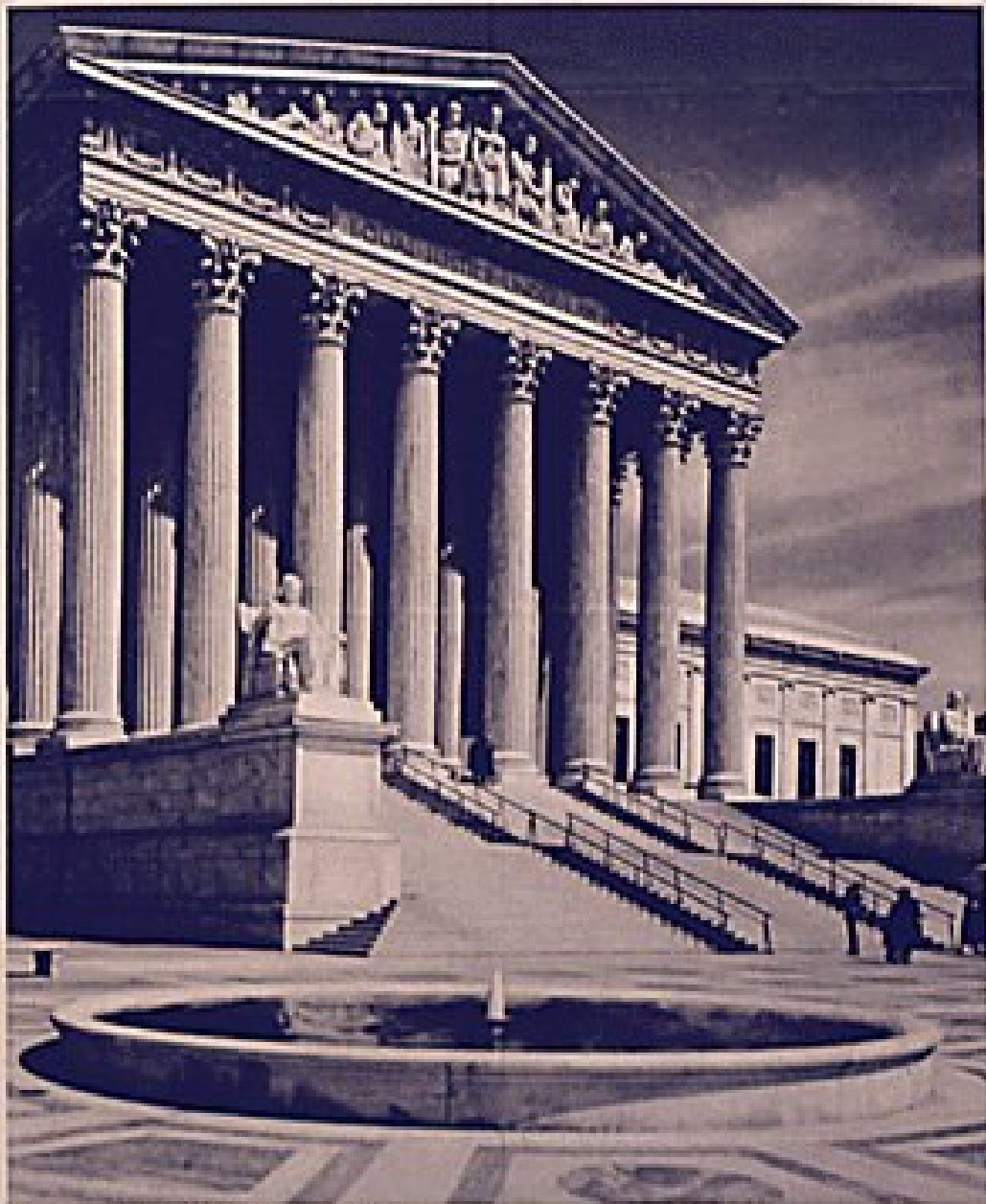

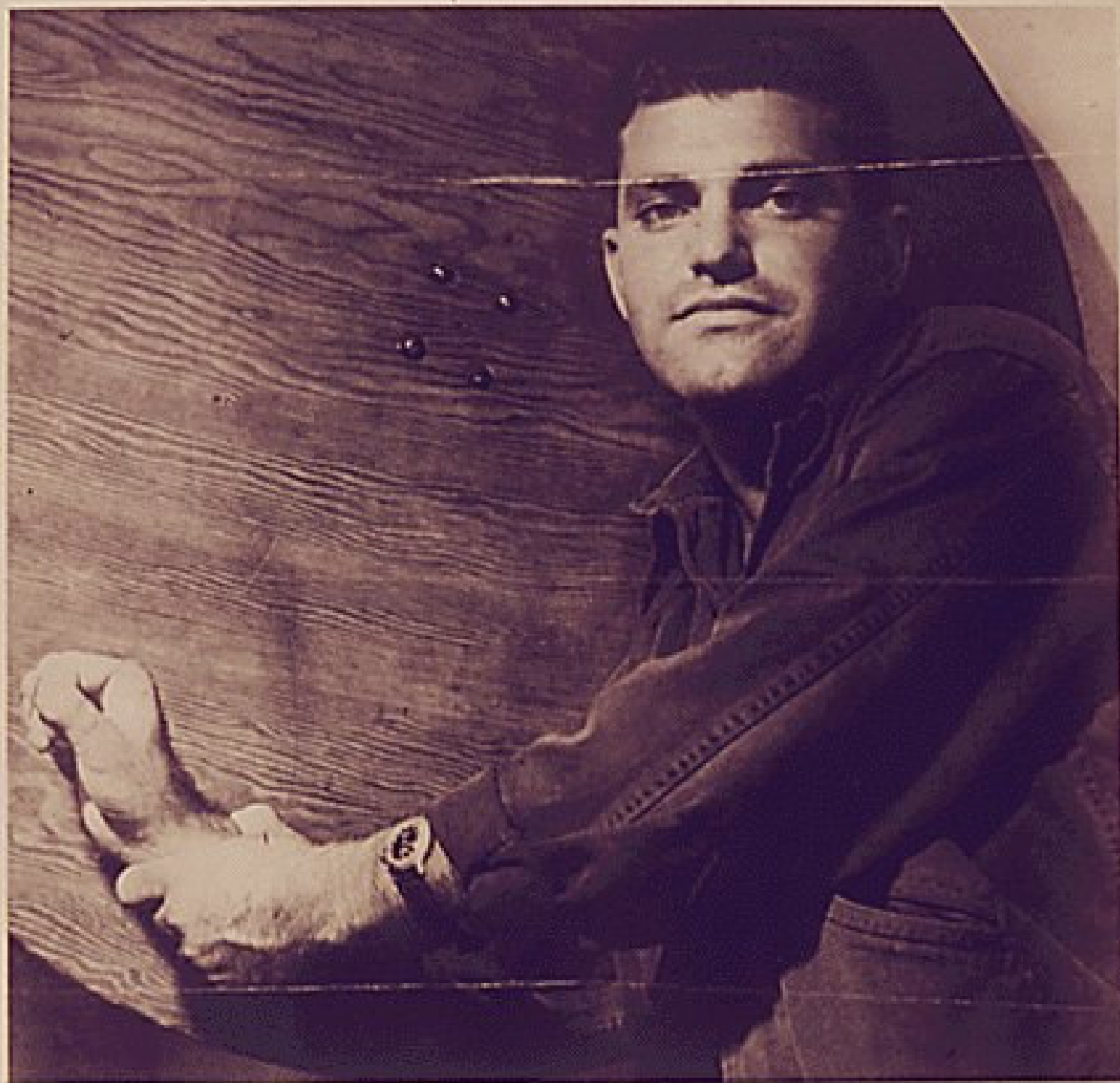

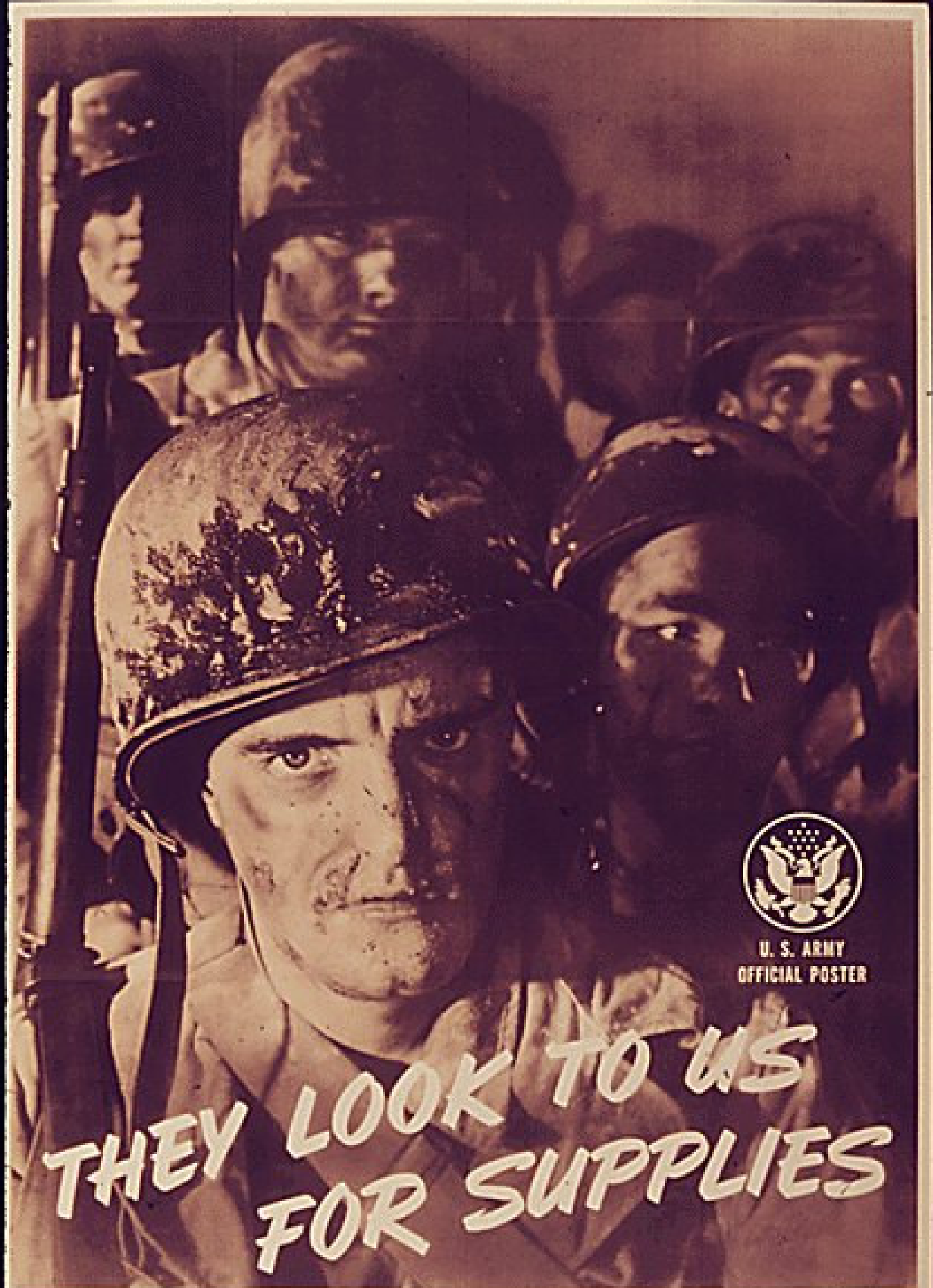
"I was on a 10-man patrol that penetrated two miles behind the enemy lines in Italy. We walked right into an ambush. The Japs opened up on us from a group of houses. They poured it into us with machine guns, rifles, and mortars. Only five of us got back. I was hit in the right shoulder by a 'bump gun'—a German machine pistol. They took me to an evacuation hospital on the beach at Anzio. The hospital was shelled the

second day I was there. I'd just been operated on. My tent was full of amputation cases, some of them pretty bad. When the shells started falling it was pretty tough. Two nurses were killed. But the other nurses—they just kept right on working through the shelling. They were just kids, most of them, and they didn't seem to have enough help, but they had courage and skill enough to make up for anything else they lacked."

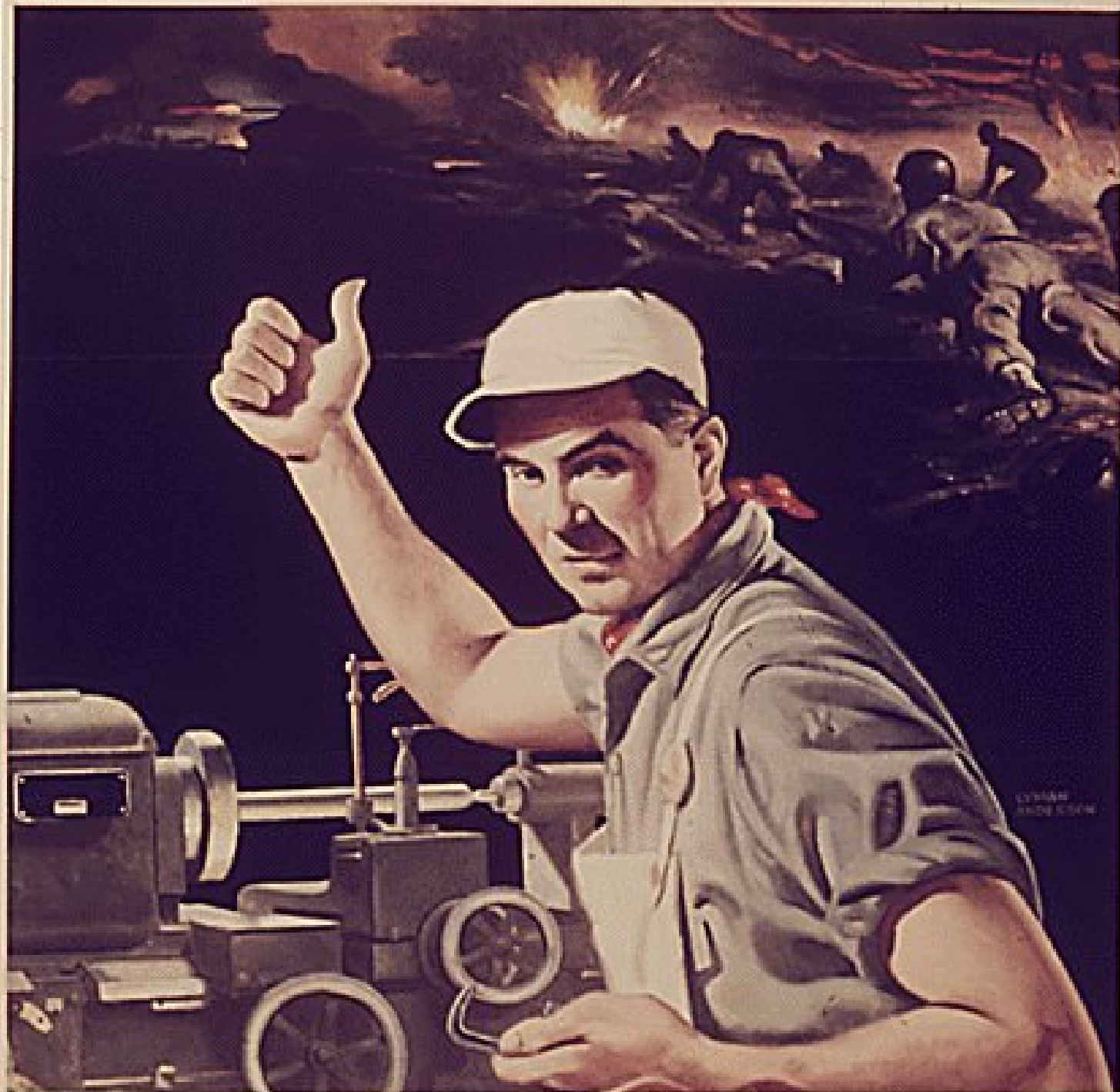

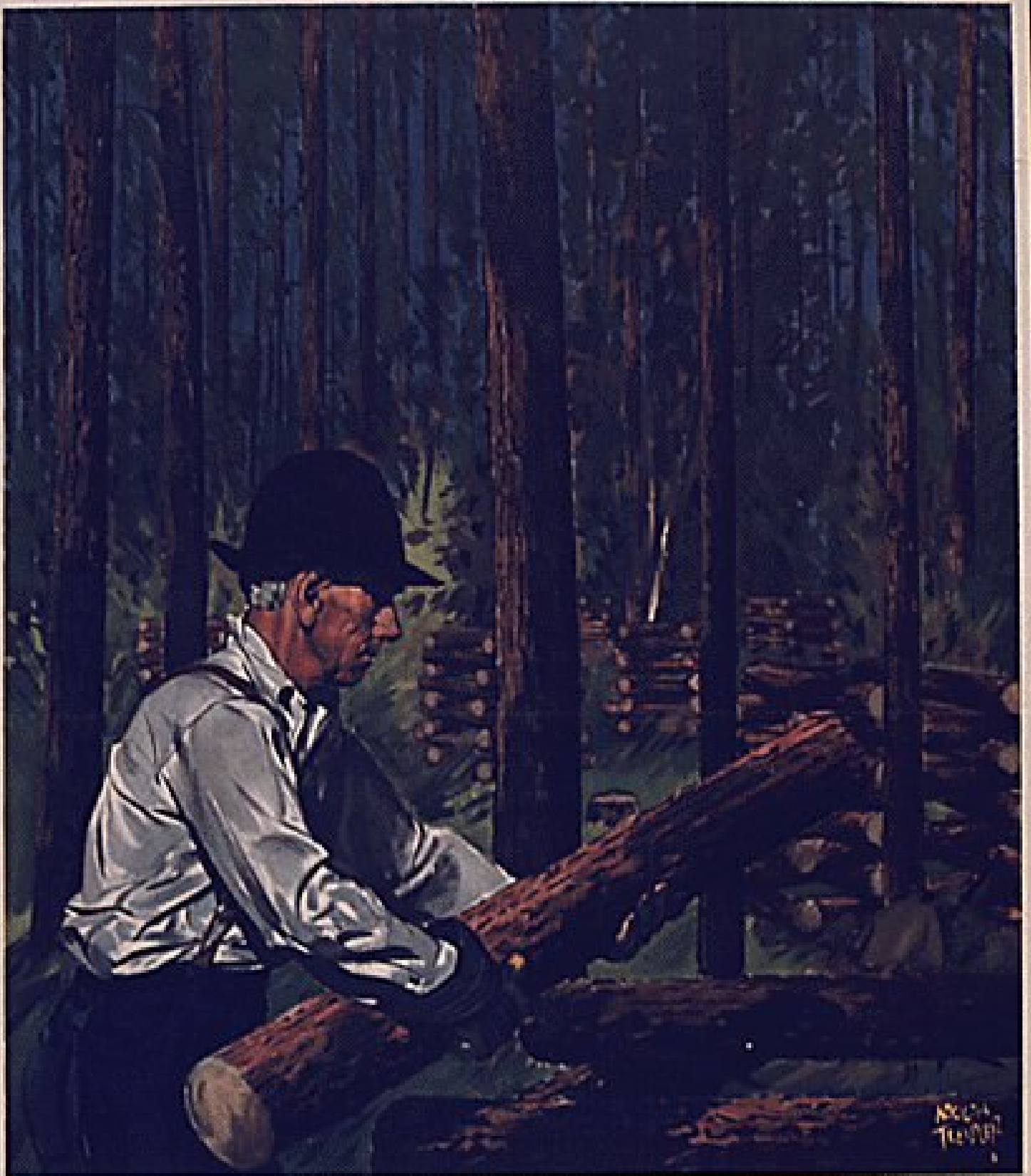

BE CAREFULLY REPEATED FOR

TO THE PRODUCTION DRIVE COMMITTEES:

Sick and injured war production workers lose 8,000,000 work-days every month.

We must save as many of those lost days as we possibly can for the Production Drive.

Only healthy workers can put into the drive what it takes — vigor, staying-power and the will to win.

It is your job to fight sickness and accidents. See to it that every medical and engineering means of prevention is provided in your plant. Make it a healthful working place.

Help the men and women in your plant to keep themselves healthy and on the job. You can do this by training them in health conservation and safety as carefully as you train them in efficiency.

Use your influence to see that your community has an active public health department; enough doctors, nurses and hospital beds to care for your workers and their families. Your Federal and State governments are doing their part. Make sure your community does its part.

If your plant is not already conducting a sound industrial hygiene program, write to the United States Public Health Service, Washington, D. C., for advice. Do it today. You can boost production, save time and lives if you start now. A day for Victory.

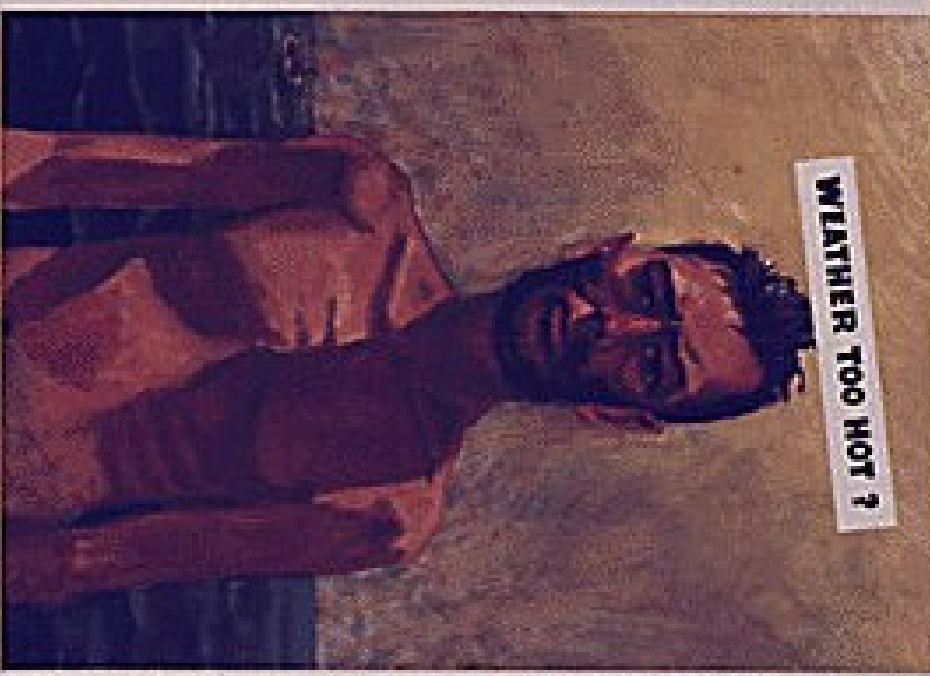

 The boys usually gain 10 pounds, lose five pounds in the service. Take a lot less time to lose their weight backing and fighting than

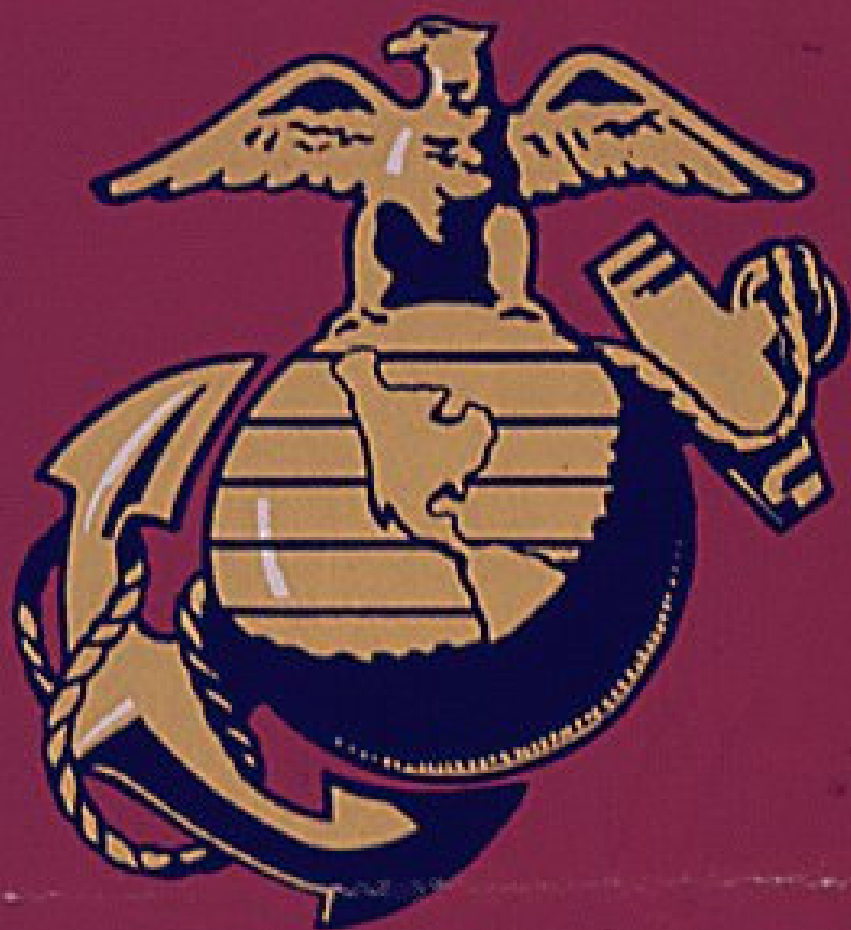

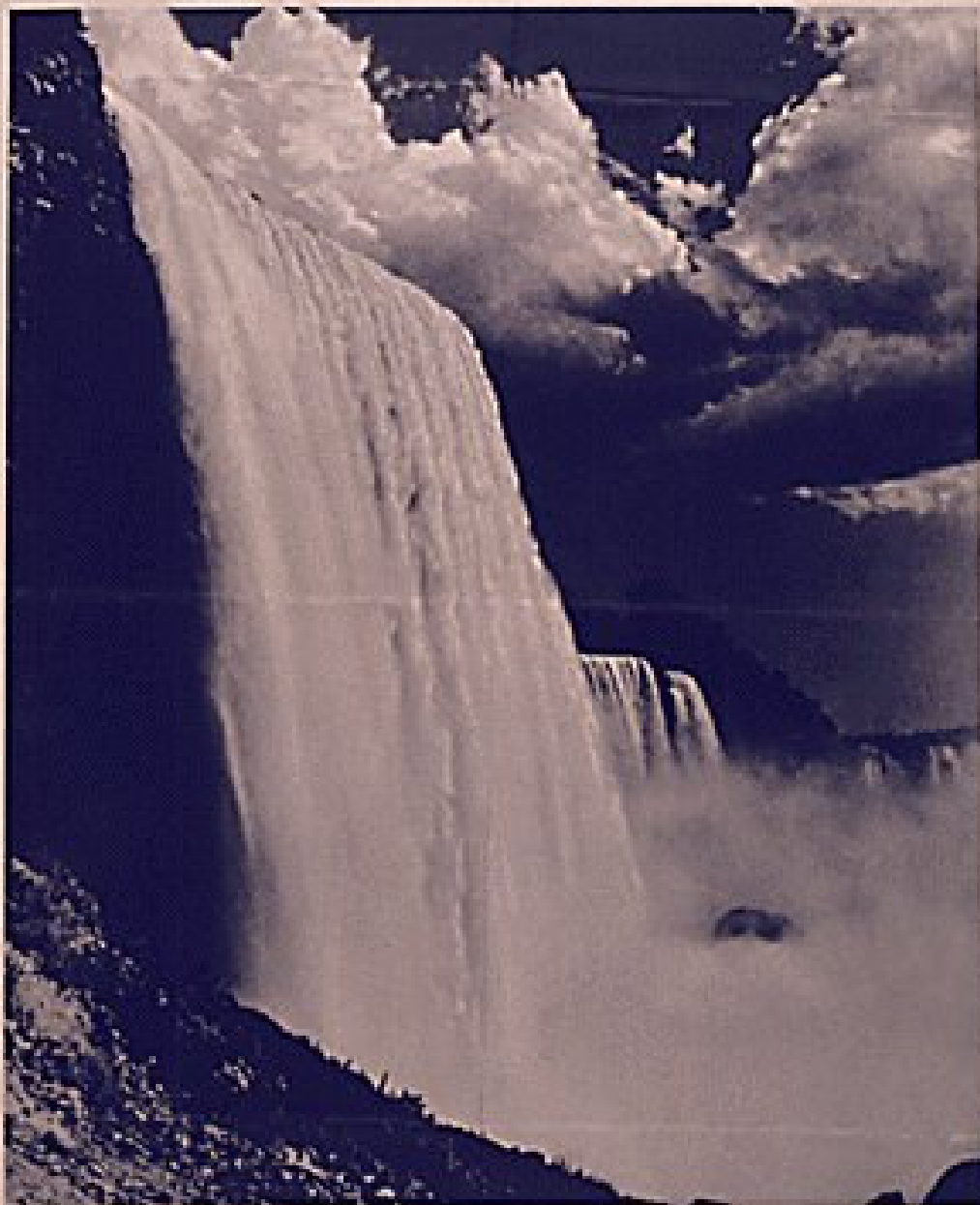

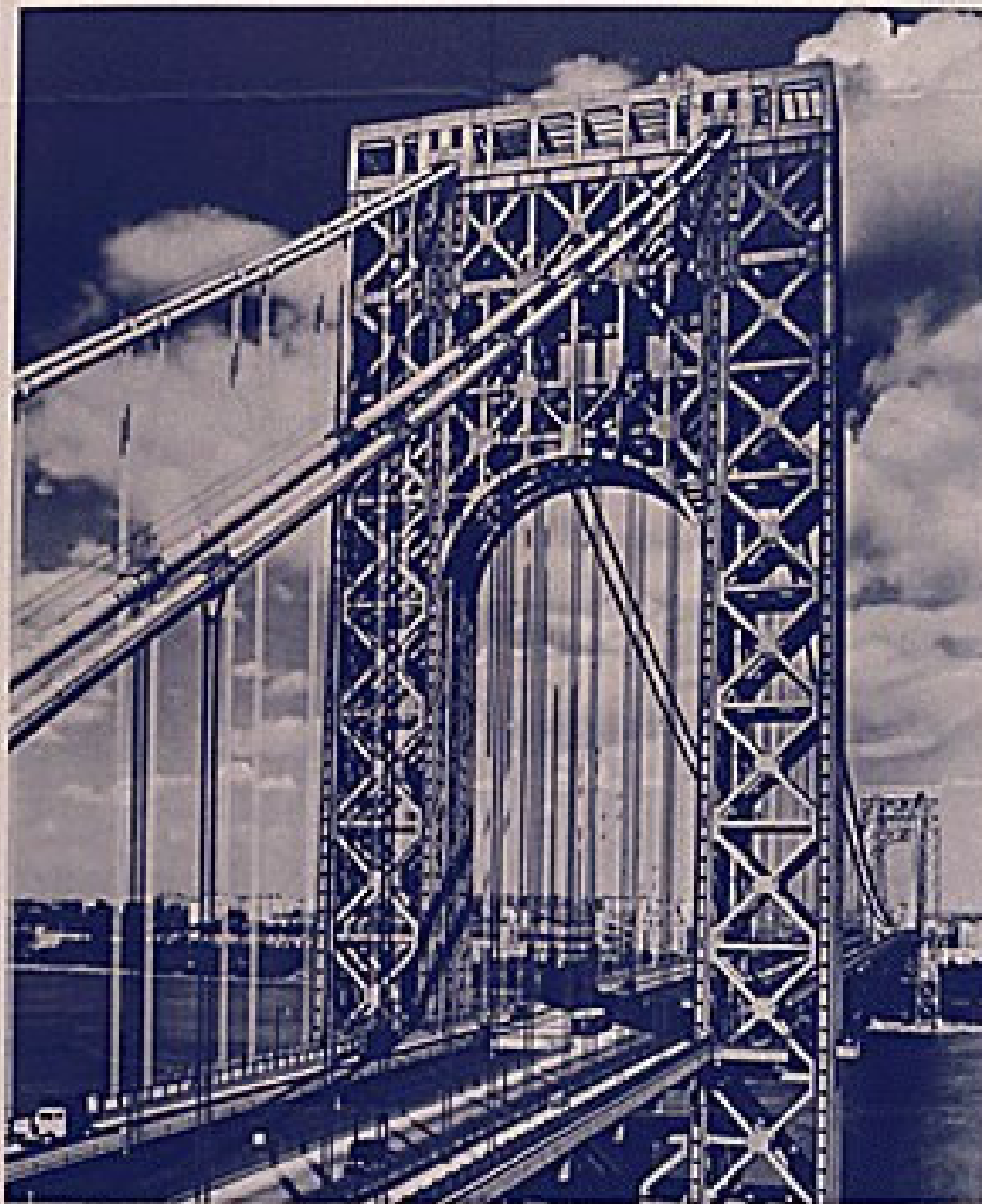
