

STORY OF THE U.S.S. SOUTH DAKOTA


Ordered in December, 1916, as Battleship No. 27, the battleship SOUTH DAKOTA was launched on June 17, 1919, at the Cranston, N. H., yard of the New York Ship Building Company. She was among the first capital ships to commission after World War I. SOUTH DAKOTA and her sisters are the only four modern U. S. battleships that carry a single turret.



THE Atlantic Charter

THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and the Prime Minister, Mr. Churchill, representing HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM, being met together, deem it right to make known certain common principles in the national policies of their respective countries on which they base their hopes for a better future for the world.

1. *Their countries seek no aggrandizement, territorial or other.*
2. *They desire to see no territorial changes that do not accord with the freely expressed wishes of the peoples concerned.*
3. *They respect the right of all peoples to choose the form of government under which they will live; and they wish to see sovereign rights and self-government restored to those who have been forcibly deprived of them.*
4. *They will endeavor, with due respect for their existing obligations, to further the enjoyment by all States, great or small, victor or vanquished, of access, on equal terms, to the trade and to the raw materials of the world which are needed for their economic prosperity.*
5. *They desire to bring about the fullest collaboration between all nations in the economic field with the object of securing, for all, improved labor standards, economic advancement and social security.*
6. *After the final destruction of the Nazi tyranny, they hope to see established a peace which will afford to all nations the means of dwelling*
in safety within their own boundaries, and which will afford assurance that all the men in all the lands may live out their lives in freedom from fear and want.
7. *Such a peace should enable all men to traverse the high seas and oceans without hindrance.*
8. *They believe that all of the nations of the world, for realistic as well as spiritual reasons, must come to the abandonment of the use of force. Since no future peace can be maintained if land, sea or air armaments continue to be employed by nations which threaten, or may threaten, aggression outside of their frontiers, they believe, pending the establishment of a wider and permanent system of general security, that the disarmament of such nations is essential. They will likewise aid and encourage all other practicable measures which will lighten for peace-loving peoples the crushing burden of armaments.*




The U.S. COAST GUARD **NEEDS OFFICERS**

THE United States Coast Guard Reserve Officers Training School is open to college men holding a Bachelor's (or better) degree from an accredited university or college, who are twenty to twenty-nine years of age (inclusive) and unmarried. Course runs from three to four months and is given at the Coast Guard Academy, New London, Connecticut. Cadets, upon satisfactory completion of this training are eligible for commissions in the United States Coast Guard Reserve.

Pay of a cadet while in training for a reserve commission is at the rate of \$750.00 per year, plus an allowance for subsistence. After graduation the cadet is eligible for commission as Ensign at a pay rate of \$125.00 per month plus allowances. Traveling expenses to and from the Academy are paid by the Coast Guard.

Detailed requirements for entrance and descriptive information may be obtained from your local Coast Guard Recruiting Office or by addressing the COMMANDANT, U. S. COAST GUARD, WASHINGTON, D. C.

[*Next course is scheduled to start early in February. Subsequent classes commencing about every four months.*]

On February 13, 1943, Mr. Paul V. McNutt, chairman of the War Manpower Commission, made the following statement:

"The whole objective of the Manpower Program is to have the right workers in the right war jobs at the right time. It is not helping your Government reach that objective if you have a job which is useful to the war to find a place doing something for which you have no skill."

THE OPERATION OF TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS AND THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT IS A WAR JOB. . . . It has been designated by the War Manpower Commission as an essential activity. . . . Remember this, and if your job as a truck driver or a mechanic is the highest skilled job you can perform, you are the right worker in the right job.

STAY ON THE JOB AND DO NOT TRANSFER TO WORK WHERE YOUR PARTICULAR SKILL IS NOT USED TO ITS HIGHEST CAPACITY.




